

'Monetary architect' suspends operations of Liberty Services

Von NotHaus awaiting trial involving the sale and use of Liberty Dollars

Liberty Services, the business that provides Liberty Dollars, has suspended operations until the trial of its owner can be completed.

Bernard von NotHaus, the "monetary architect" behind the copper, silver, gold and platinum medals, which he calls private voluntary barter currency, entered a "not guilty" plea in U.S. District Court for the Western District of North Carolina, Statesville division, July 28.

A federal grand jury May 19 in North Carolina indicted von NotHaus and three associates on charges involving the sale and alleged use of the Liberty Dollars as current money.
